#### Craft & Play Literacy:

Create patterns! Children will cut out the shapes and then create their own patterns. Point out to parents and caregivers that this project is a great opportunity to talk about shapes and colors, in addition to patterns!

A set of Unifix cubes are also included. Let children and parents play and create patterns with those as well.

#### Early Learning Tip:

Patterns are everywhere! Take a walk and ask your child to point out repeating patterns that he or she sees along the way.



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
